Curriculum Intent

At Wickersley Partnership Trust we aim to ensure our Drama curriculum is designed to sequence learning and embed the key skills and knowledge that are required for our students to become confident, creative and insightful. Students are encouraged to be not only independent but also collaborative and cooperative learners.

We teach a wide range of acting and technical design skills that fosters an enthusiastic appreciation of the theatrical form and a sense of enjoyment and fascination for stories and characters, their messages and themes. Through Drama, our students explore a range of social issues and cultural influences. The opportunities that we offer beyond the drama studio aim to provide unforgettable experiences and a vital contribution to school life.

Year 9 Curriculum

9.1 Rehearsal Techniques: DNA

Students develop their understanding of plot, structure and character through a number of established rehearsal and explorative techniques. They stage scripted extracts and devise their own practical work. Students also consider the theatrical design elements of set, scenery and stage lighting.

9.2 Staging Types and Design Elements

Pupils learn about different theatrical staging types including proscenium arch, traverse, in the round and thrust. They explore each space type practically and learn how to articulate how these impact on the staging of drama texts. In this unit, pupils are introduced to a wide range of theatrical design elements and experiment with creating their own work in the areas of sound, costume and set.

9.3 Text in Performance

Pupils study and rehearse a key extract from a published play script for formal external assessment. They learn how to demonstrate an understanding of the playwright's intentions when interpreting the text for performance. Pupils who have an interest in theatre design can elect to be assessed via this route. Pupils reflect on their practical work through a written Evaluation.

9.4 Performance Skills: Combat and Conflict

Pupils learn how to effectively create tension and conflict in improvised drama scenes and extracts from the play Bang Out of Order! They learn a range of stage combat moves such as punches, slaps, kicks, strangle and stab to equip them with a range of physical techniques for use in their scripted practical work.

9.5 Practitioner Study: Bertolt Brecht

Students study and explore practically the techniques of the revolutionary German drama practitioner and playwright. They experiment with techniques such as narration, direct address and vocalising scripted stage directions. Students develop their knowledge and practice of ensemble and multirole work. They learn how to incorporate placards, physical theatre and song into their original devised work and interpretations of scripted play extracts.

9.6 Devising Theatre

Pupils devise a piece of theatre in response to a visual stimulus which demonstrates the techniques of the theatre practitioner, Bertolt Brecht. They create and develop ideas to communicate meaning to an audience by researching and developing ideas and amending and refining the work in progress. Pupils also consider design elements in creating their work. The final piece is performed to an audience.

Assessment Points



In all Y9 Drama study units, students are taught to speak confidently and effectively through improvising, rehearsing and performing play scripts in order to generate language and discuss language use and meaning, using role, intonation, tone, volume, mood, silence, stillness and action to add impact. (English Programmes of Study: Key Stage 3 National Curriculum in England)
