Dear Parents/Carers,

As we enter the 2026/27 academic year, we are sharing important updates regarding both our **Homework Policy** and our **Assessment Policy** for mainstream students in all year groups. I would also like to tell you that all students will be provided with a student planner to help with their organisation.

### **Homework Policy**

Homework is a vital tool for consolidating classroom learning, building independent study habits, and preparing students for assessments through a "little and often" approach. Our homework guidance has been updated to ensure consistency across all departments, clarity for students and parents, and to support your child's academic progress.

### **Homework Frequency and Duration**

All homework tasks are set with a standard deadline of exactly one week so students have plenty of time to complete the work. Each student will receive one homework per week in English, Mathematics, and Science. For all other subjects, they will receive one homework task each fortnight.

The schedule on the final page of this letter, which is also printed on Page 6 in student planners, should be used as a suggestion for when students complete homework activities. Students can choose to follow the schedule or to decide upon their own schedule to fit alongside their other commitments.

Before in-class assessments, mock exam windows, and the final Summer exam series, homework activities will focus specifically on required revision. For KS4 students, additional Directed Reading and independent revision expectations are designed to accommodate subject revision sessions.

### **Student Expectations**

To manage their workload effectively, students are required to:

- Bring their planner and equipment to school every day and place their planner on their desk each lesson.
- Write down all homework tasks and exact deadline dates in their physical planners during dedicated lesson time.
- Complete homework before the deadline—ideally on the night assigned or the day received—and tick off completed tasks in their planner.
- Utilise Homework Clubs or seek teacher guidance before the deadline if assistance is required.

## **Assessment Policy - Academic Progress and Reporting to Parents**

At Wickersley Partnership Trust, we want all students to leave able and qualified to play their full part in an ever-changing world. Our curriculum is designed for all students to experience a variety of academic subjects, whilst also enabling them to make positive life choices so they are healthy, polite and respectful. With this in mind, we set challenging targets against national standards so students make excellent progress and achieve their academic potential.

### **Target Setting**

Targets are set for all students based on performance in their KS2 SATS. For students in Years 7-9, they are given a Target Band. Students in Years 10 & 11 receive the actual Target Grade within that band.

### **Reporting to Parents**

There will be three opportunities during each academic year for you to gain insight into your child's academic performance for students in Years 7-10. One opportunity is through parents' evening, and two through academic reports. For students in Year 11, there are two further academic reports. Dates of all academic parents' evenings, along with other key information, can be found on the final page of this letter.

Assessments measure student performance across a range of subjects within scheduled assessment weeks, allowing teachers to gain an understanding of what students know and what they need to develop further. The information gained within these weeks will be sent home in an Academic Report. Development areas for students directly impact teachers' planning to help your child make as much progress as possible during their time at school, aiming to get outcomes in Year 11 that support them in their future. To give you advanced notice of the assessments for each Year Group, please see the final page of this letter.

During the final four weeks of the school year, End of Year Exams for Y7/Y8 and Year 10 Mock Exams will take place.

Mock Exams for Year 11 take place on the following weeks:

- Week Beginning 5th October 2026 - English Literature
- Week Beginning 12th October 2026 - English Language, Mathematics, Sciences
- Week Beginning 30th November 2026 spread over 2/3 weeks - Mocks in all subjects
- Week Beginning 22nd February 2027 spread over 2/3 weeks - Mocks in all subjects
